### New Community Centre

The resident’s 15 year campaign for a replacement of the old Grange Centre in Pine Place, has taken a significant step forward. Cllr Peter Curling has supported the residents with this campaign and brokered a deal with the Leader of the Council, which has resulted in plans for a brand new community centre to be built within the next year. A Community Association is in the process of being formed in order to ensure that the residents are involved in the building and running of the new centre. Cllr Peter Curling has attended various focus group meetings and whole heartedly supports the residents with the formation of this new Community Association.

### Protecting Charville’s Green Spaces

Cllr Peter Curling believes that the Green spaces of Charville should be protected, he has actively campaigned against the un-necessary urbanisation of Charville Lane, particularly with regard to the U7 bus route extension.

Cllr Curling is also working with John McDonnell MP and the Charville Lane, Langdale Drive & Grosvenor Avenue Residents Association on a campaign to smarten up the green spaces along the Eastern section of Charville Lane in order to restore the area around the Golden Bridge to its former glory.

This has already resulted in a couple of associations being formed, and the residents have achieved various environmental improvements as well as highlighting local issues to the Council by organising petitions and inviting council officers to their association meetings.

The Conservatives have run Hillingdon Council since 1998 and their record has been abysmal. The independent Audit Commission has judged the council's performance as follows:-

## Hillingdon's Record of Stagnation Under the Tories



- 2002 - Hillingdon's Performance score - **FAIR**
- 2003 - Hillingdon's Performance score - **WEAK**
- 2004 - Hillingdon's Performance score - **WEAK**
- 2005 - Hillingdon's Performance score - **2 STAR**
- 2006 - Hillingdon's Performance score - **2 STAR**
- 2007 - Hillingdon's Performance score - **2 STAR**
- 2008 - Hillingdon's Performance score - **2 STAR**

The Star rating ranges from 4 stars for Excellent performance to 1 star for poor performance

Over 90% of Councils in the country have scored 3 or 4 stars

Hillingdon is now one of the 3 worst performing councils out of all the London Boroughs
